OVERVIEW

Ongoing commitment to community contribution

BEAR Scotland's CSR Committee developed a programme to ensure a positive footprint was delivered within the communities in which it operates in.

The annual budget of £20,000 was retained for 2022 and we set a target to build on the success of 2021, which saw almost £38,000 donated to good causes.

The strategic approach was to ensure that this was spent on charities and projects around the country that would make in impact in ways that align with BEAR Scotland's values.

Employee buy-in and engagement in the programme was also a key driver. The benefit of this is that it embeds the message within the workforce that we work in partnership with the communities where we work.

This report provides an overview of what's been delivered as a result of that investment.

Five pillar approach



There are five strands to BEAR's CSR strategy as follows:

- **1. Ongoing, long-term charity partnerships**. These are with organisations that we've committed to supporting within our NMC quality submissions to Transport Scotland.
- 2. Annual national charity partner. We ask the workforce to vote on a charity of the year that we commit to support. The idea is that it not only ensures a key focus is delivered for a specific cause but the involvement of the staff in identifying it should ensure some dedicated support and engagement in fundraising efforts.
- **3.** Regional/local charity programme. Employees are asked to nominate a smaller local cause which we will donate £1,000 to. The idea is that these will be more local initiatives that will appreciate the financial boost. It might be an organisation that is close to the heart of the person who nominated it.
- **4. Supporting employee fundraising challenges**. We are keen to support the efforts of team members who take on fundraising personal challenges by giving them a significant donation.
- **5. Support for community clubs and initiatives**. As well as traditional charities we consider applications to support local clubs and organisations such as youth sports groups and community groups.



1. ONGOING CHARITY PARTNERS

Within our NMC quality submissions to Transport Scotland These are with organisations we committed to supporting some charities on an ongoing basis



£20K + RAISED

As an organisation we've committed to raising at least £10,000 per year for Cash For Kids.

In 2022 that target has been smashed, with a total of £20,372 being donated as a result of two activities – the staff raffle in January and the Corporate Charity Golf Day in September.

£910 was raised in the staff charity raffle.

£19,462 was raised at the Corporate Charity Golf Day





£2,010 RAISED

Twenty BEAR employees signed up to Doddie Aid, the six week participation event at the start of the year. They ran, walked, cycled and hopped their way to a total of 3,439 miles between them and raised £505, which BEAR match funded making a total of £1,010 for the charity.

A £1,000 donation was made to Doddie Wier's memorial fund.









£3,728 RAISED

BEAR Scotland's Staff Football Tournament returned for the first time in three years.

£3,728 was raised for SAMH, which included a £2,000 donation from Highways Management Group. The remainder was raised through team entry fees.





£120,000 + in social value to SBMC

BEAR is a member of the RBLI Tommy Club which supports veterans. We also work in partnership with Armed Forces Recovery Centres and the Careers Transition Partnership to encourage new recruits from the forces.

We are continuing to work with Scotland's Bravest Manufacturing Company as the preferred sign supplier. We also support with PR – including the latest <u>story</u> about delivering over £120k in social value.

Additionally £250 was donated to RBLI's winter campaign.






2. ANNUAL NATIONAL CHARITY PARTNER

We undertake a vote where all staff are given the chance to vote for the Charity partner of the Year. The idea is that the shortlist contains organisations that are Scotland wide and complement the existing long-term partnerships.



£5,404 RAISED

Scottish SPCA achieved 26% of the staff vote. See outcome below.



As a result various initiatives were developed and a total of £5,376 as well as numerous donations of pet toys, blankets and food were delivered to animal rescue centres.

STEPPING UP SUPPORT ACROSS THE BUSINESS

In May we linked Scottish SPCA fundraising to Eurovia's Steps to Health Challenge. We managed to raise a total of £442, which was topped up by BEAR to total £1,027.

We also donated various useful items to SSPCA, including bedding, food and toys which were distributed to SSPCA centres across the country.

The final fundraiser of the year to raise more funds for SSPCA was linked to Christmas Jumper Day. Staff were asked to wear their festive jumpers to work and donate £5 to the charity. £792 was raised.



3. REGIONAL / LOCAL CHARITY PROGRAMME

At the start of the year, employees are asked to nominate a smaller local or regional cause which we will donate £1,000 to. The idea is that the six organisations chosen will be more local initiatives that will appreciate the impact of the financial boost. It might be an organisation that is close to the heart of the person who nominated it.

In 2022 we ensured that two organisations in the region of each unit, NW, NE and SE benefited from this programme.

Jess ran the 13.1 miles in 2 hours and 1 minute, raising £370 which was topped up by a £250 corporate donation by BEAR.


